

Missions Biblical Challenges: TO TREE, OR NOT TO TREE?

Many Christians question the meaning of the Christmas tree, since its origins are not biblical. However, the symbol of the evergreen fir tree, which indeed was originally been used to celebrate winter pagan festivals, has become an irreplaceable element of our Christmas celebrations. It is believed that the first person to bring a Christmas Tree into a house, in the way we know it today, may have the 16th century reformer Martin Luther. He was believed to have been awe-struck by the scene — on a crisp, clear winter's night walk of bright stars twinkling through evergreen branches. It was so beautiful, that he went home and told his children that it reminded him of Jesus, who left the stars of heaven to come to earth at Christmas. He was the first to add candles to such a tree as decoration because he wanted Jesus' light to shine on his family as well. There were German immigrants who brought the tradition of the Christmas tree to the US in the XIX Century. Although they were openly decried by Puritans declaring such 'heathen symbols' demean the sacred holiday, our society has eventually given the Christmas tree an important place in our Christmas celebrations. We in Northwoods celebrate this old Christmas tradition through our Giving Tree. It becomes for us not just an ancient and beautiful tradition, but the way we can show solidarity and compassion with those who need our help most, whether homeless, homebound seniors, children with no beds or immigrants. And so, I believe we are challenged every Christmas through our Giving Tree to give those people in return what God has given to us. At the end, we all can rejoice and celebrate Jesus' birth around the evergreen fir tree, a symbol of God's everlasting love because immigrants decided to bring this tradition to our country. To tree or not tree, that seems to be the challenge for us on Christmas.

GETTING TO KNOW OUR MISSIONS PARTNERS:

Bonding Against Adversity (BAA): "Helping Others Help Themselves" From the formation of Bonding up to today, Bonding has recognized one of the greatest needs in Texas is assistance for Lawful Permanent Residents (LPRs) who are gualified to become United States citizens. In 2010, BAA initiated healthy living and citizenship assistance programs. All were designed to provide education and assistance to these underserved communities. In 2014 there were 20 classes held in several different organizations, hosting 800 participants. There are more than eight million lawful permanent residents in the United States. The goal is to help those in our community reach the goal of citizenship by removing the barriers and complete the citizenship process. Bonding Against Adversity provides citizen workshops, citizenship preparation classes, and parenting education programs. Additionally, it also provides fee-waiver assistance and attorney consultations throughout the immigration process. Through these efforts, Bonding assists more than 1200 LPRs per year in becoming U.S. citizens. Go to https://baatexas.org for more information and to see how you might get involved.


