FINDING HOME SUNDAY February 23rd!

Many of you have heard me say on more than one occasion that I am not worried about the state of Northwoods for the next five years, but I am very concerned about ten, twenty or thirty years down the road. Church affiliation, along with attendance, continues to decrease - especially with younger generations.

Mainline denominations are growing smaller and older. Our New Covenant Presbytery has closed or lost over thirty Presbyterian churches in the last few decades. And we have seen it in our own congregation with members who have passed away, moved cities or stopped attending.



So, the question facing our congregation is what do we do with this church reality? Do we accept this decreasing witness of the church and slowly cut programs, personnel and lower expectations? Or do we decide Northwoods is going to buck the trend? The church has always faced challenges and difficulties. And whether society affirms it or not, I actually do believe what we say almost every week in our services – everyone needs a church home, an extended family!

Our recently adopted LOOK goals seek to counter this declining church trend: Live our faith, Offer community, Open doors and Kingdom build! Our programs and ministries are trying to connect people with God, each other and our world. These LOOK goals are not just limited to the staff and leaders, but for our whole church. They are all important goals. We all need to LOOK for ways to OPEN THE DOORS and invite others into our church community.

During the month of February our sermon series is Animate! – Bring Your Faith to Life. We will be using 4 popular PIXAR movies as parables to illustrate what a faithful life looks like: Toy Story, Coco, Inside Out and Finding Nemo. Our staff has planned some creative ways to make this series meaningful and memorable. One hope is that we live out Jesus' invitation for Peter as well as all disciples to fish for people. We want everyone in our church to think about someone they know who is not connected to a church family and invite them to our church. So during the first couple of weeks in the series, we want you to write his/her first name on a fish and attach it to a fishing net located in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall. But more than that, we want you to actually OPEN THE DOOR and INVITE them to come to church with you on Sunday, February 23rd. That Sunday we have planned some extra special ways to welcome visitors: including food, fun and fellowship. The movie we will be focused on that Sunday is *Finding Nemo*, so we will call it FINDING HOME Sunday. We know this is not necessarily natural for all of us, but is something that all can and need to do if Northwoods will be around for our children and children's children.

So please pray that God would use you to be the OPEN DOOR to help someone experience the blessings of being part of God's extended family.

Missions Biblical Challenges "Where there is love there is God"

If we could pick only one scripture in the whole Bible that represents the core belief for our work in the Missions ministry, it would perhaps be the words of Jesus in Matthew 25: "Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me... When you did this to the least of these my brothers and sisters, you did it to me..."

We could spend a long time reflecting on this passage whose emphasis in the early church was primarily on the end of the world.

While the timing of this event has always remained as a mystery for our minds, the way Christians are called to be prepared for the coming of God seems here very clear.

Service to the least among us is in Jesus' words what makes us ready to encounter God. It becomes the most fundamental and practical way to love Jesus, the ultimate expression of love for God.

As much love we put into service, so much of Jesus' presence becomes real in our lives. As mother Teresa stated: "Where There is Love, There is God". The same way that Jesus' words in Matthew have for centuries challenged Christians to put into practice their love for Jesus, so Mother Teresa's statement has inspired Christians to find God in serving others. As we approach Lent in this month, we will invite you to participate in our book discussion group on Tuesdays during the season of Lent, where we will be discussing the same book by Mother Teresa: "Where There is Love, There is God".

MUSIC AND WORSHIP

In my office, I have displayed a random collection of art, every bit of which was given to me as a gift. About half of it consists of hand-made items, from tapestries, to ceramic art, to paintings. The other half was given to me with the comment, "this made me think of you when I saw it."

The latest addition falls into this latter category and it is a framed piece of art that depicts a piano keyboard with these words emanating from the keys: "When words fail, music speaks." When I first read it, I giggled a bit as I thought back to something a music colleague of mine said in frustration to her employer priest who kept cutting music out of the worship experience, "Father, it's not like people leave Mass humming the sermon!"

It's true, though, isn't it? Words can be very moving, inspiring, powerful, coercive, emotive. But the proverbial "ear worm" is never a word. It's always a song. That thing that sticks around, that creeps into our consciousness, that plays on an endless loop as we're drifting to sleep or sitting in traffic – it's always a song. Songs are catchy. This is why they're used in advertising, even singing the advertiser's phone number to make it stick. This is why the Psalms are songs – so they'd be remembered, written on the hearts of believers and passed down from generation to generation.

There is a scene in one of my favorite silly movies ("Elf"), when spontaneous carol singing has broken out at Central Park and everyone appears to be singing with all they have. But the son looks at his dad and says, "You're not singing. You're just moving your lips." The father protests, that it doesn't matter if he's actually singing. But the son insists, for the spirit of Christmas requires full commitment, not just lip service. As social as many of us are, it is often difficult to gather together and expose our inner selves and our faith through outward dialogue. I think it makes a lot of us feel uncomfortable to do so. But what about singing? What if the next time you gather in worship, you throw your head back and sing with all you have? How transformative might it be to speak sing aloud your beliefs? How glorious to be a part of a singing church. When words fail, music speaks!

I look forward to seeing you in worship!
